Although the book is without competition as a multifaceted documentary text of modern black nationalism's theoretical assumptions, operational agenda, and promotional efforts, it complements Wilson J. Moses's Classical Black Nationalism: From the American Revolution to Marcus Garvey (New York Univ.
